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**'THE GOOD CONDUCT PRISONERS' PROBATIONAL RELEASE ACT,

(Punjab Act X of 1926).

[27th August, 1926].

An Act to provide for the release of good conduct prisoners ob conditions imposed by the 2[Provincial Government].

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the conditional j release from prison of good conduct prisoners in certain cases before the completion of the term of imprisonment to which they have been sentenced, and whereas the previous sanction of the Governor-General under sub-section (3) of section 80-A of the Government of India Act has been obtained ; It is hereby enacted as follows:—	Preamble
1. (1) This Act may be-called the Good Conduct Prisoner's Probational Release Act, 1926.	
H(2) It extends to the whole of the Province of 4[North-West Frontier Province] except 5(Tribal Areas]. (3) It shall come into force 6on such date as the 2[Provincial Government] may by notification appoint in this behalf.

<p>(1) for the form and conditions of licenses on which prisoners may be released ; (2) for defining the powers and duties of Government officers, societies or persons, under whose authority or supervision conditionally released prisoners may be kept ; (3) for defining the classes of offenders who may be conditionally released and the period of imprisonment after which they may be so released ; (4) generally for carrying into effect all the purposes of this Act.</p>
